

ELIGIBILITY & REQUIREMENTS FOR ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIPS

ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP INDIVIDUAL

This category is designed for individuals who are either:

- not eligible to be collaborative professionals, do not actively practice as part of a collaborative team; or
- are retired professionals who have made significant contributions to the field. This
 category includes academics, patrons, members of the judiciary, other professionals who
 support the principles of collaborative practice, and former collaborative professionals
 who have retired or ceased practice.

There are no voting rights associated with this category of membership

Eligibility and Requirements:

Commitment: Demonstrate a commitment to the principles of collaborative practice.

Status: For non-member individuals – not otherwise eligible for full membership.

For previous members - Previous membership as a collaborative professional in good standing and retirement from active practice or

cessation of practice due to other reasons.

Fee: Payment of the Associate member individual membership fee of \$100

per annum

Benefits:

Educational and Professional Development Opportunities - Access to AACP educational resources, workshops, and training materials

Networking Opportunities - Access to AACP events, conferences, and seminars to connect with collaborative professionals

Resource Access - Partial access to AACP Resource Library, including educational materials and publications

Member Updates - Regular updates on industry news, events, and initiatives within the collaborative practice community.

Recognition (for the category of former members in good standing) - Formal acknowledgment of contributions to the field of collaborative practice.

ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP STUDENT

This category is tailored for individuals who are currently enrolled in academic programs related to law, conflict resolution, or other fields relevant to collaborative practice. This category provides students with opportunities to learn about collaborative practice and engage with professionals in the field.

There are no voting rights associated with this category of membership

Eligibility and Requirements:

Enrolment: Currently enrolled in an academic program relevant to collaborative practice.

Verification: Verification of student status

Fee: Payment of the Associate member student membership fee as determined

from time to time.

Benefits:

Educational opportunities - Access to selected AACP educational resources, workshops, and training materials

Networking Opportunities - Opportunities to connect with professionals in the collaborative community.

Mentorship Opportunities - Access to mentorship programs to learn from experienced collaborative professionals.

Member Updates - Regular updates on industry news, events, and initiatives within the collaborative practice community
